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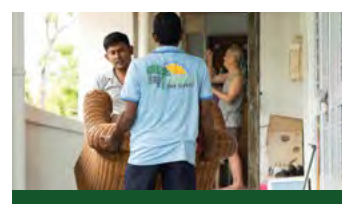
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CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

UPCOMING PROJECTS

Estate Rejuvenation for Tampines Changkat Zones 1 and 8

The Tampines Changkat Neighbourhood Renewal Programme (NRP) Batch 11 public consultation showcased preliminary design plans for Blocks 338 to 370.

Exciting enhancements that residents can look forward to include upgraded parks and gardens, an inter-precinct connector, as well as covered drop-off porches and linkways. There will also be playgrounds, fitness corners and more seating areas for senior citizens.

"We've come a long way," said Mr Desmond Choo. "Older estates have more space. We are going to make changes to the parks and build connectors." As the NRP is fully funded by the government, these changes will come at no cost to residents.

Mrs Zain, a 102-year-old resident, is looking forward to taking strolls in the upcoming park. Mdm Shireen Lee, 64, agreed. "The park is where we can do exercises. It looks inviting, surrounded by trees," she said.

The NRP can only proceed with a 75% 'yes' votes from residents.

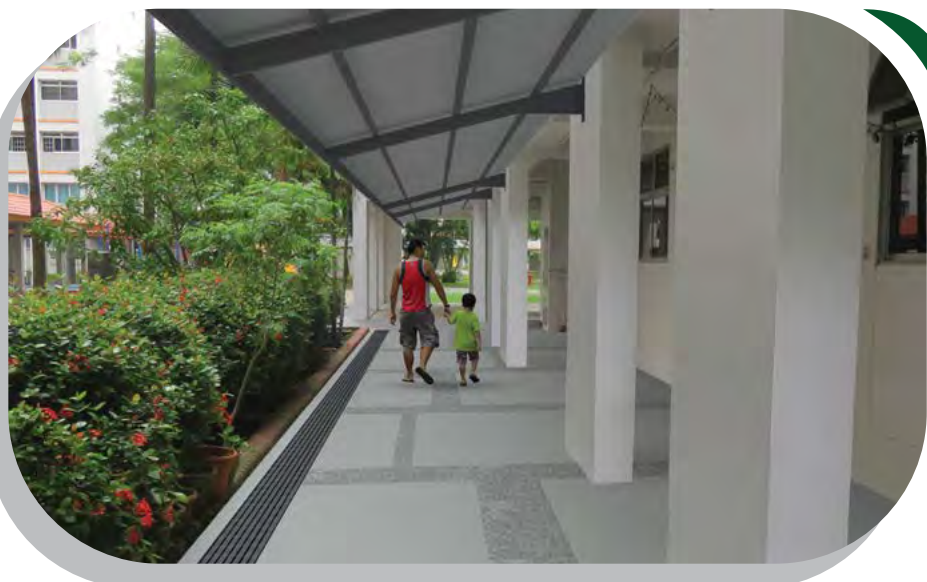

UPCOMING PROJECTS

Corridor Farming: Growing Food at Your Doorstep

With the support of our residents and partners, Tampines will bring urban farming closer to residents' doorstep. We are testing the feasibility of growing vegetables in the corridor using a horizontal planter. The pilot project will be carried out in selected blocks of Tampines East. The planter is designed by Nature's International Commodity, our partner responsible for the rooftop urban farm on the multi-storey carpark at Blk 723A. As the planter is hung against the parapet wall, this will avoid corridor clutter and obstruction caused by potted plants.



Subject to approval by the authorities

We have shortlisted our first batch of volunteer farmers to work with the Town Council on this pilot project. We conducted a briefing session with the volunteers and they were very excited about the project. Subject to approval by the relevant authorities, we plan to extend the project to involve other residents. The selection of suitable corridor farmers is based on criteria such as the amount of sunlight their corridors receive. We seek residents' understanding on this matter. ABC Waters @ Sungei Tampines: Fresh Look and Cleaner Water



ABC Waters at Sungei Tampines is part of PUB's Active, Beautiful, Clean (ABC) Waters programme, a long-term initiative to improve water quality and transform drains, canals and reservoirs in Singapore into scenic waterscapes. A 1.4 km section of Sungei Tampines was recently upgraded to benefit Tampines residents.

This part of the canal, which lies between Tampines Avenue 7 and Tampines Expressway (TPE), has 30 per cent more drainage capacity to better manage floods. The whole area is enhanced with the naturalisation of the canal bank adjacent to Tampines Eco Green, island planters and greening of the canal base. Rain gardens will cleanse stormwater runoff from Tampines Eco Green and the surrounding areas before being discharged into the waterway.



The newly revamped area also includes facilities that encourage an active lifestyle and act as linkways to other parts of the neighbourhood, such as a new footpath and lookout decks along Tampines Eco Green, a reconstructed and enhanced cantilevered park connector and linkway near TPE, and a new bridge near Block 496C.

"The canal's facelift makes the area more conducive for a jog or a walk. It's also a great area for families to gather," says Tampines resident Ashley, 43.

TAMPINES TREE PLANTING

Carnival 2022 | In Conjunction with the Completion of the Large Scale Town Wide Project-Tampines Community Spine



Tree Planting Day was extra special for Tampines residents because it also marked the completion of the Large Scale Town Wide Project under the Tampines MRT viaduct. Part of the Tampines Five-Year Master Plan that was announced in 2020, the project promotes urban sustainability and active living among residents.

The 1-kilometer linear park stretching from Tampines Town Centre to the Pan Island Expressway is a busy thoroughfare now offering eight new zones with attractive amenities.

MPs for Tampines GRC and residents participated in a tree planting and subsequently name unveiling ceremony for the Large Scale Town Wide Project. The name of the project, "Tampines Community Spine", was chosen by residents through an online poll.

Tampines resident Ms Dila, 34, said her family had fun completing the entire trail. She also noted that the event was helpful in showing residents the different facilities available. "At the same time, it is also good to educate our young about the natural environment," she added.

On the right track to become a model walking and cycling town!

Since 2019, Tampines Town Council has been partnering with Lee Kuan Yew Centre for Innovative Cities, Singapore University of Technology and Design, in a study to explore how different neighbourhood-built environments in Tampines can affect the walking needs of residents. The study is expected to be completed in March 2023.

Preliminary results show that nearly half of residents surveyed prefer walking to their everyday activities. It was also found that routes passing through natural settings encourage walking. Being a garden town, Tampines is moving in the right direction to become a model walking and cycling town.

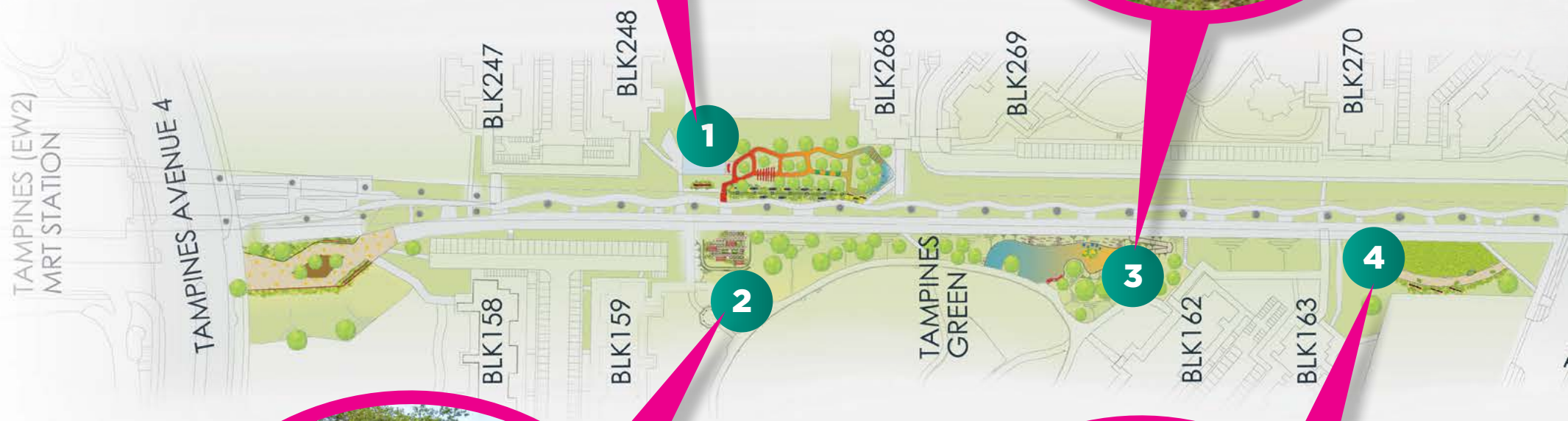
1 BIKE MAZE

A cycling track that runs through colourful arches. The bike maze offers fun and excitement to young cyclists as they pedal over humps and overcome obstacles.



3 MOUNDS PLAYGROUND

The playground has trampolines for the little ones to jump on, tunnels to burrow through, and swings designed to cater for all ages. It is the ideal place for parent-child bonding activities.



2 THE GARDEN

Sit amongst the flowers in The Garden and enjoy the company of loved ones while appreciating the beauty of nature.



4 THE PLAINS

The green space is accented with decorative screens. It is the perfect tranquil spot to stretch and exercise while appreciating the lush greenery.

5 THE STREAM

A boardwalk with new deck seats and light installations. The bioswale acts as a natural filter for rainwater and beautifies the surrounding landscape.

7 THE CASCADE

A rain garden drains rainwater run-off using natural filters and rejuvenates the surrounding landscape by enriching biodiversity.



6 SWINGS UNDER THE TREES

Swings are placed in the shade of existing large trees for families and other park-goers who can reminisce about old times while taking a breather after a walk or jog.

8 ADVENTURE FITNESS CORNER

It is equipped with a sloping adventure play area for children and fitness corner for the elderly.

A Day in the Life of Property Officers

Tending to some 200 monthly requests from residents whilst overseeing maintenance and upkeep of a staggering 69,776 HDB units across Tampines is clearly not an easy task. It takes a special breed of unsung heroes, Tampines' Property Officers (POs), to take up the gauntlet.

POs typically begin their day with routine estate inspections, identifying areas that require enhancements or mending. Issues identified are then relayed to the relevant personnel such as cleaners and repair contractors. Overgrown trees, faulty lifts, accumulation of bulky refuse and incorrect disposal of waste are just some of the issues that POs look out for.

Besides following up on the issues identified, POs also attend to residents who raise concerns about anything from leaky ceilings to exterior blemishes, pest issues and even neighbour disputes. While POs aim to offer residents a resolution as soon as possible, some issues beyond the purview of the Town Council require additional time. Senior PO Oh Ann explained, "We have to make interim arrangements while working with other agencies, and residents may not understand that the process takes time. But we have many wonderful residents who are thankful for our help, and this motivates me."

Wanting only the best for residents, POs often go out of their way to gather residents' input and feedback on a variety of matters, including enhancement works in NRP and R&R. But it does not stop there! POs also work actively with Residents' Networks and assist in the organisation of community activities. These hardworking POs certainly deserve our support, appreciation and much more!

Bringing *Ong Lai* Home



With Lunar New Year approaching, it is once again time to enjoy the festivities and feasting with family and friends. And an all-time favourite, the pineapple tart, is a must-have at every gathering. The buttery, flaky pastry with a golden sweet-tangy pineapple filling is always hard to resist, especially when it is handmade with just the right amount of pure butter, like the ones from Beijing Confectionery.

“Our pineapple tarts are all handmade and it takes us about 10 hours to make 1000 pieces,” says the owner, Mr Leong Meng Pok.

The skin should not be too sweet or exceedingly thick or big — a simple but important distinction that differentiates the outlet's pineapple tarts from others in the market.

Residents know Beijing Confectionery for its fully wrapped pineapple tarts that resemble small pillows. This is not purely for aesthetic purposes; this way, the pineapple tart will not dry out, maintaining its shape and taste.

After more than 30 years in the business, the confectionery is also about handing down original recipes for traditional goodies to the owner's three sons.

“We feel extremely blessed and happy to be able to see each other every single day! We truly cherish the moments with our loved ones and working together as a family is no longer work, but a bonding of love and kinship,” says eldest son Zach Leong.

With two locations within Tampines, head on down early to secure other favourites, such as the melt-in-your-mouth snow white almond cookies and sugee cookies. The award-winning pastries are likely to have residents asking for more.

The Hands behind the Wheels

Colin Tan used to service Super Puma helicopters before trading them in for bicycles. A former helicopter technician at the Sembawang Air Base, he now repairs and services bicycles from the comfort of his home in Tampines.

The 42-year-old took up a bicycle servicing course when he experienced gaps in the service during the pandemic. That was how Greasy Monkeys Bicycle Servicing was born.

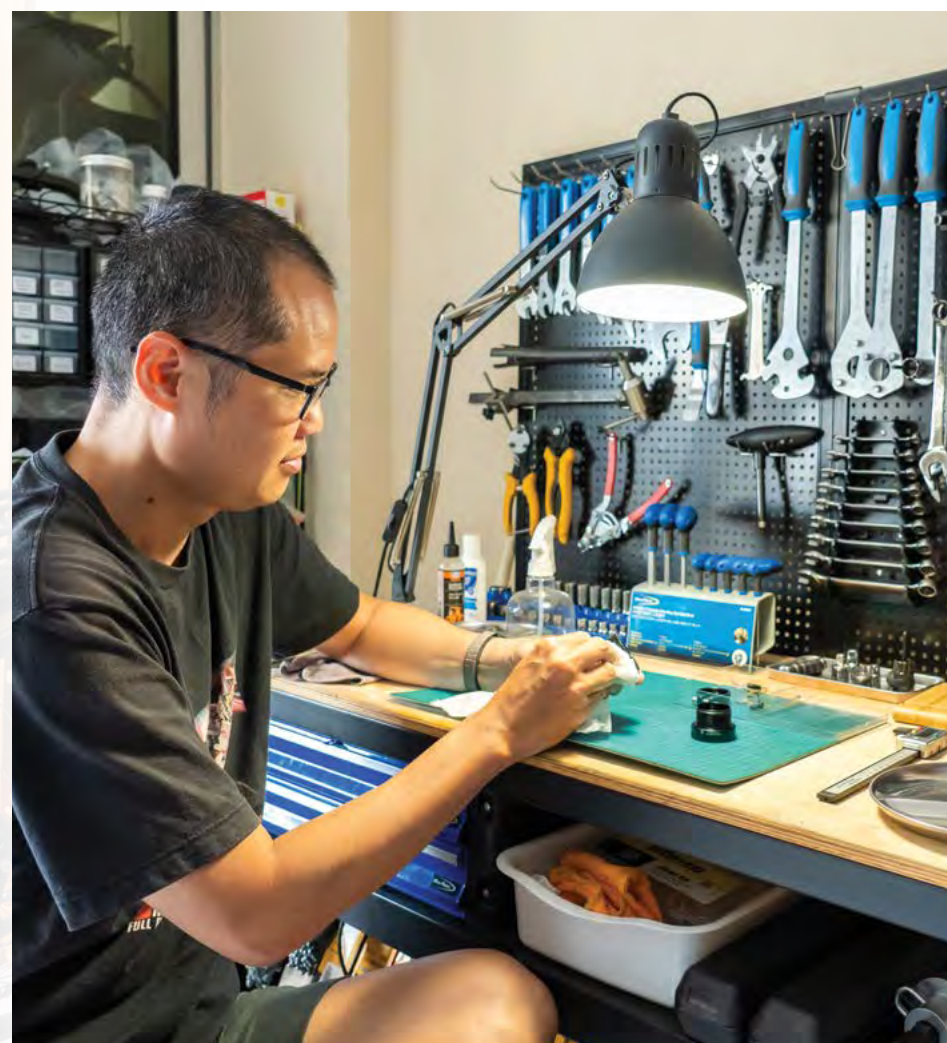
Certainly, there were challenges when making the switch, such as procuring the right tools and the right knowledge for different brands of bicycles. However, he says, "since I've been a technician before, it didn't feel like much of a change in terms of skill sets when I started".

His customers are mostly based in the east, including his fellow Tampines residents. Colin does not have plans to open a store, as working from home allows him to save on rent and work flexible hours.



Colin shares some tips on maintaining your bicycle at home. Get a chain wear checker, he says, as it is cheaper to change a chain before it is fully worn and affects the whole drivetrain. Cleaning and degreasing your bicycle may seem like a no-brainer but is essential for it to last longer.

Some of Colin's customers learn the hard way when they try to fix their own bicycles, or make cosmetic adjustments. This will only make things worse so best to leave it to the experts.
