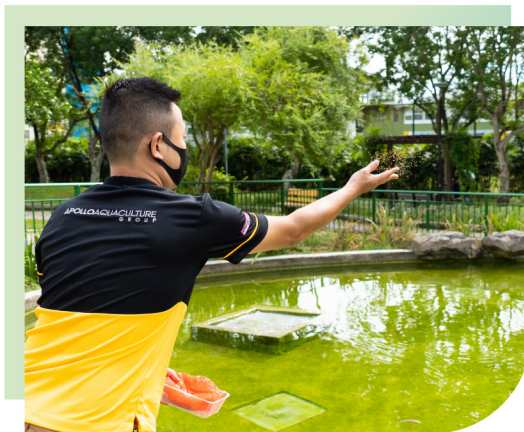


TILAPIA FISH FARM (AQUACULTURE)

Behind the Scenes

Building a Home for the Tilapia

- Cleaning the pond and removing the algae with filter mats
- Installing the pump and UV light
- Acclimatising the tilapia fingerlings
- Testing the water parameter
- Releasing the tilapia fingerlings into the pond

We built the Tilapia Fish Farm for the community. Please be socially responsible and observe the following DON'Ts:

- Do not litter the pond as it contaminates the water
- Do not release animals into the pond. Foreign animals may spread diseases or attack the tilapia
- Do not feed the tilapia. The food may make them sick
- Do not fish from the pond
- Do not climb over the fence and enter the pond
