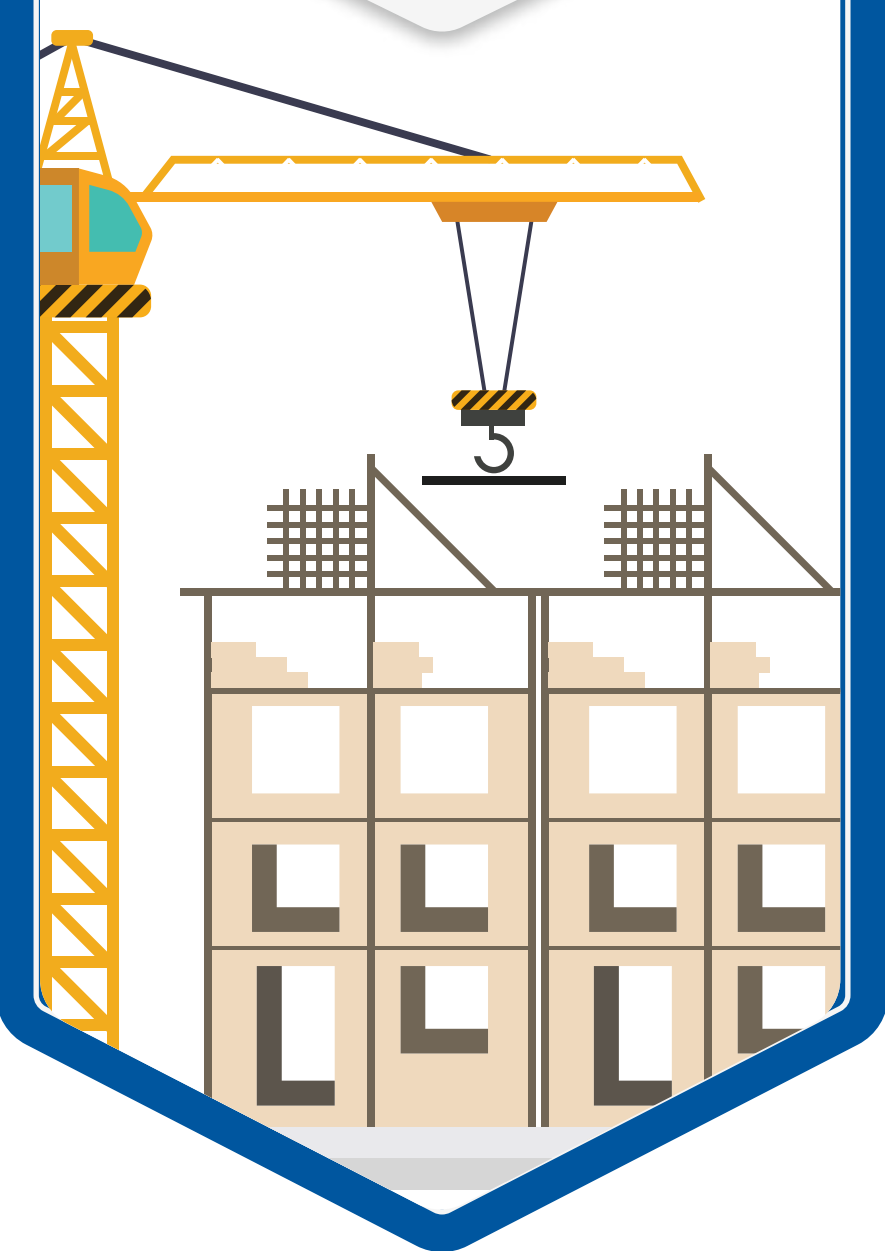

1 BIKE MAZE

A cycling track that runs through colourful arches. The Bike Maze offers fun and excitement to young cyclists as they pedal over humps and overcome obstacles.



3 MOUNDS PLAYGROUND

The playground has trampolines for the little ones to jump on, tunnels to burrow through, and swings designed to cater for all ages. It is the ideal place for parent-child bonding activities.



5 THE STREAM

A boardwalk with new deck seats and light installations. The bioswale acts as a natural filter for rainwater and beautifies the surrounding landscape.



7 THE CASCADE

A rain garden drains rainwater run-off using natural filters and rejuvenates the surrounding landscape by enriching biodiversity.



2 THE GARDEN

Sit amongst the flowers in The Garden and enjoy the company of loved ones while appreciating the beauty of nature.



4 THE PLAINS

The green space is accented with decorative screens. It is the perfect tranquil spot to stretch and exercise while appreciating the lush greenery.



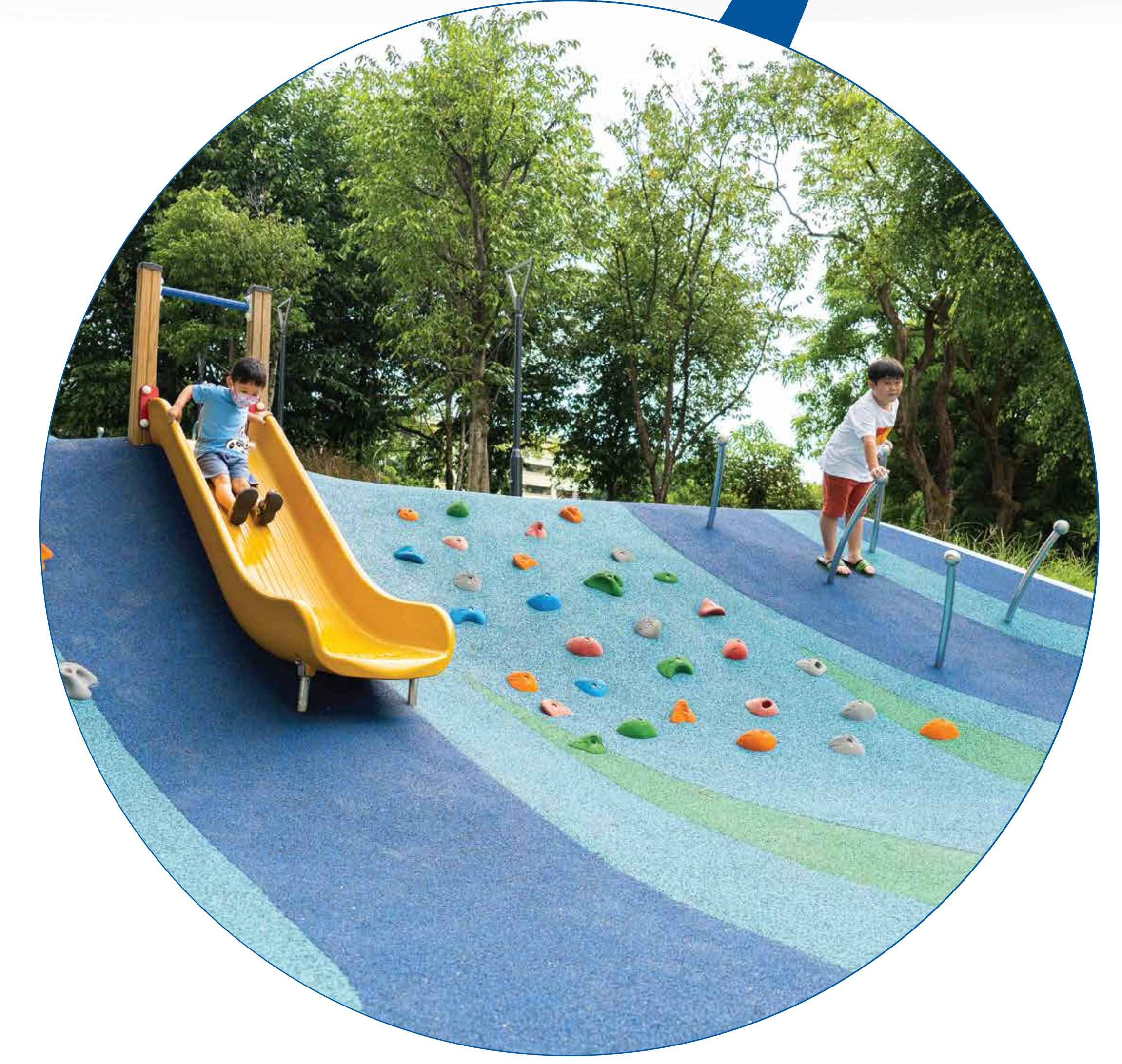
6 SWINGS UNDER THE TREES

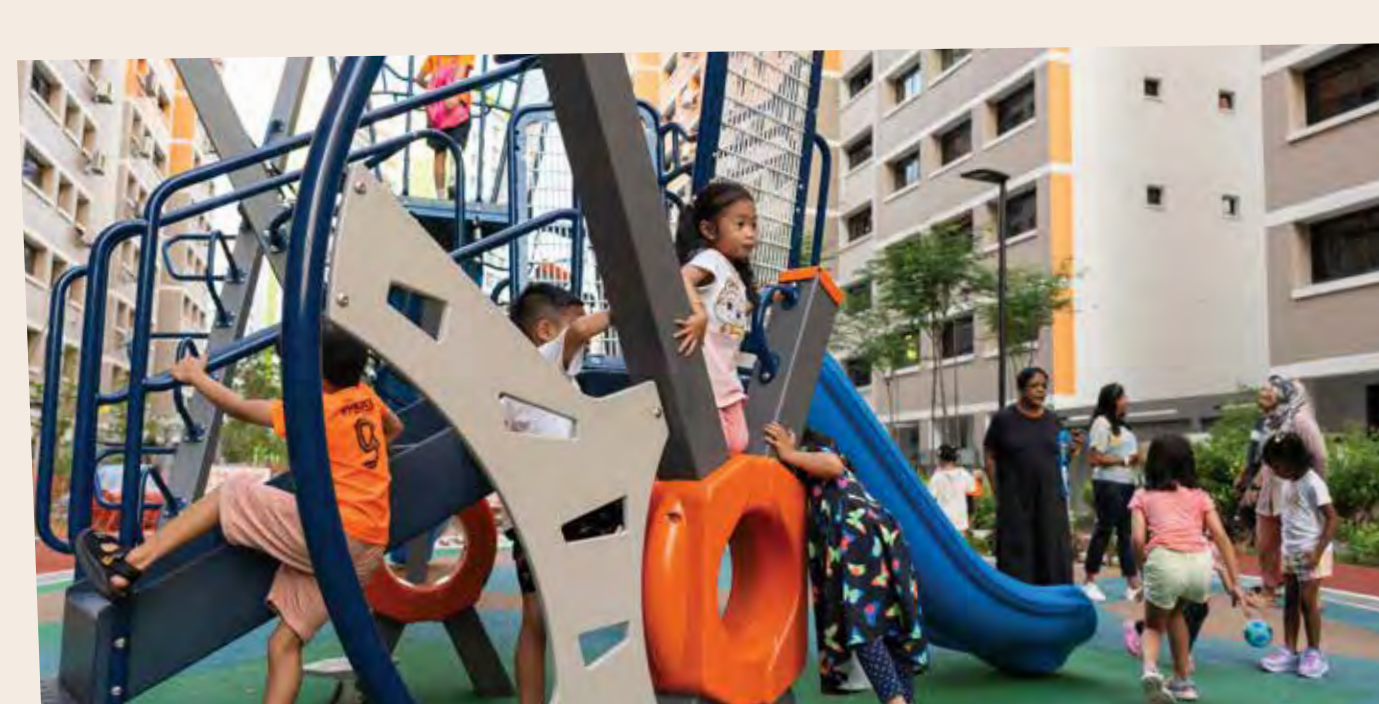

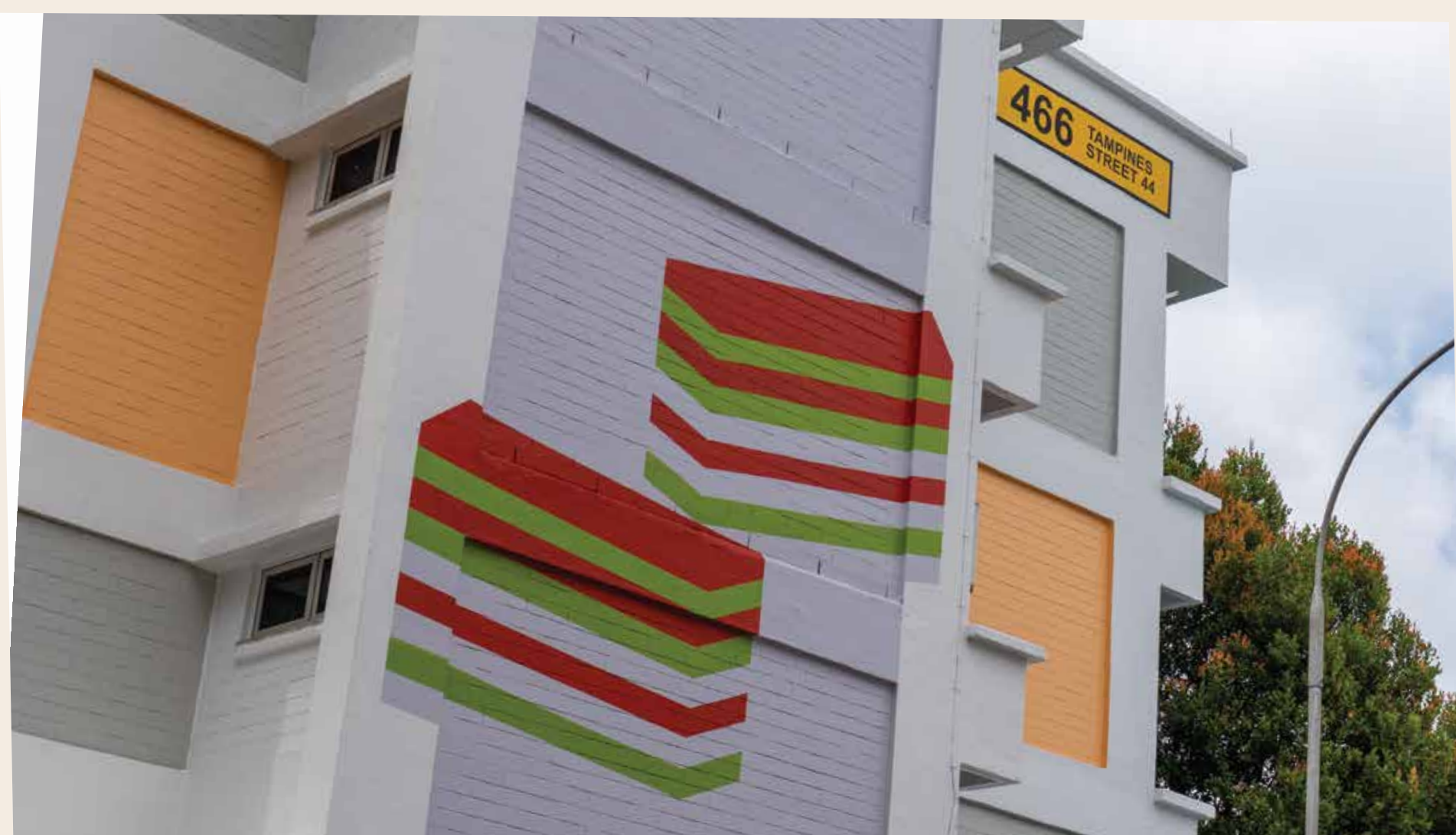

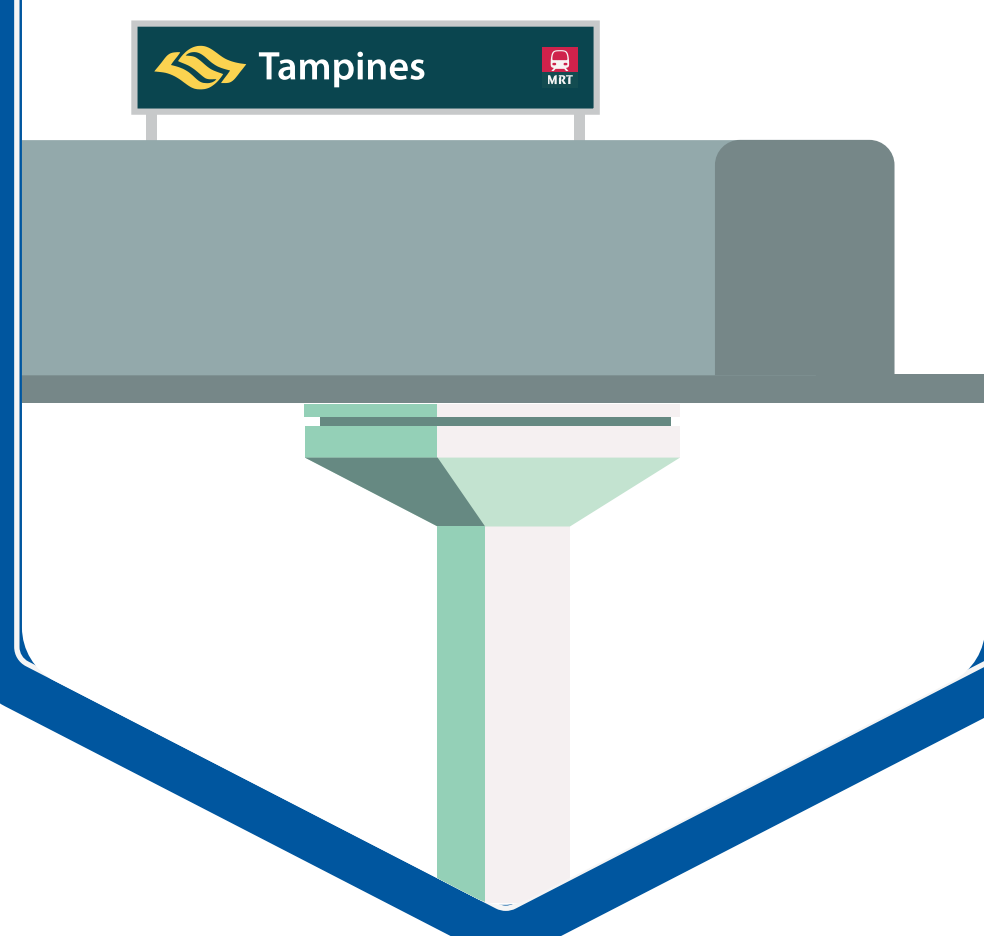
OUR 15-MINUTE TOWN

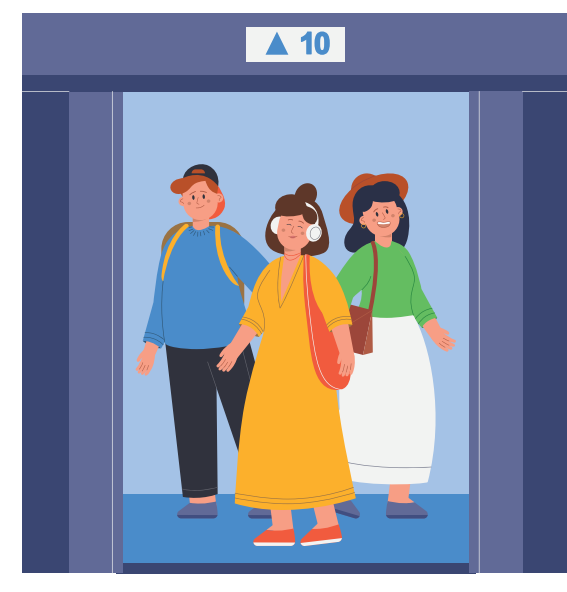

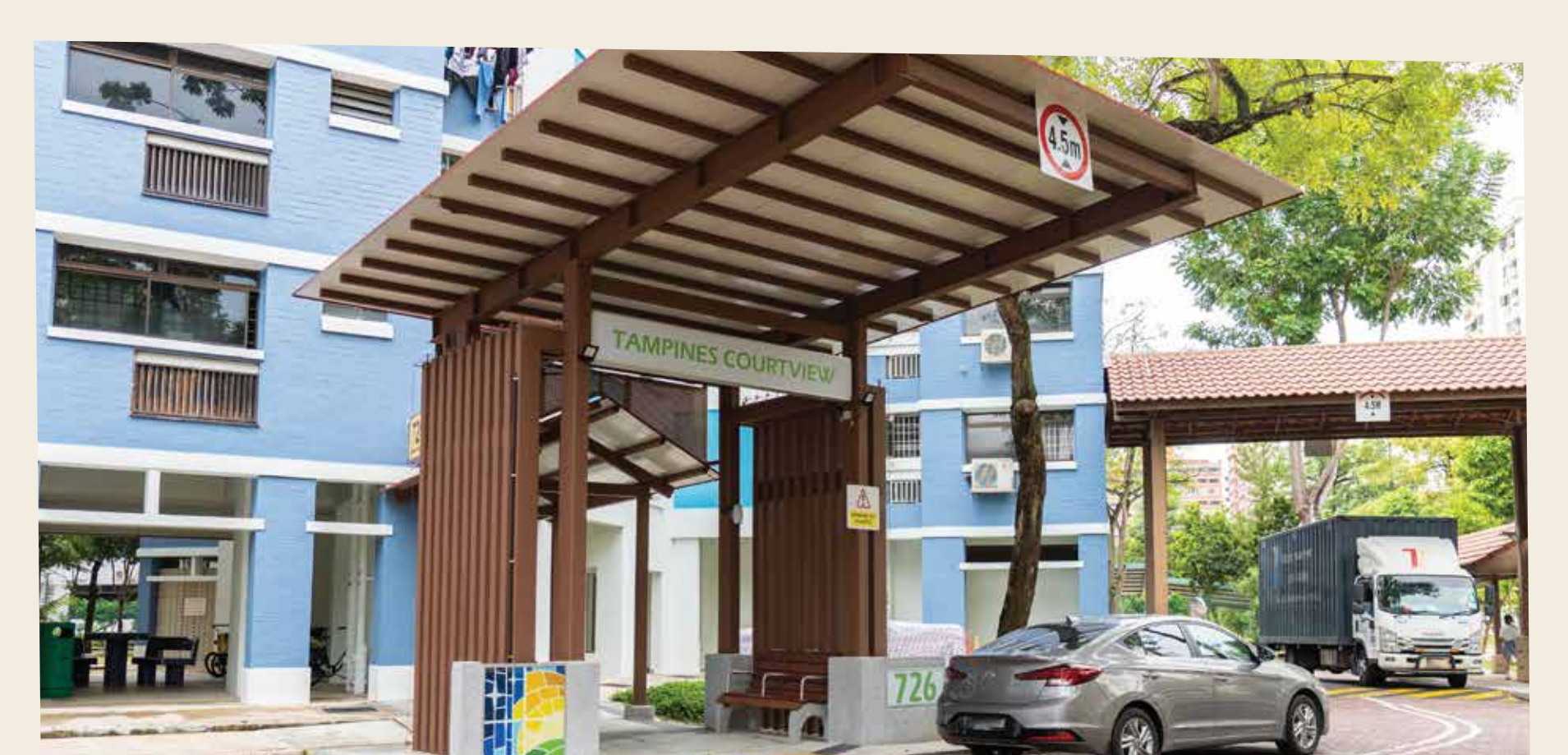

FOR NATURE LOVERS
The 36.5-hectare Tampines Eco Green is a nature lover's haven. It resembles a savannah with marshlands, secondary forests, and freshwater ponds.



FOR FAMILIES
The sprawling 13-hectare Tampines Boulevard Park, due to open by 2024, will be a one-of-its-kind play-cum fitness nature hub that families of all ages can enjoy. There are amenities such as children's Nature Playgarden, fitness corner and facilities for people with special needs.

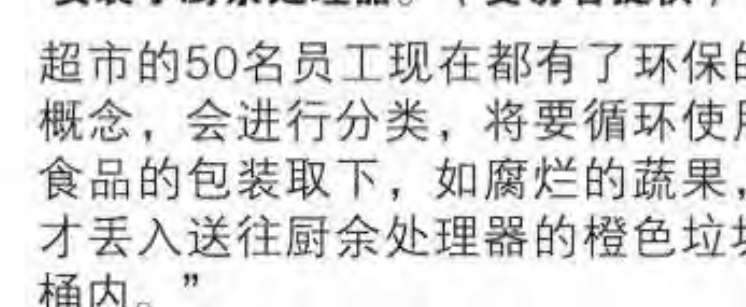


FOR FAMILIES

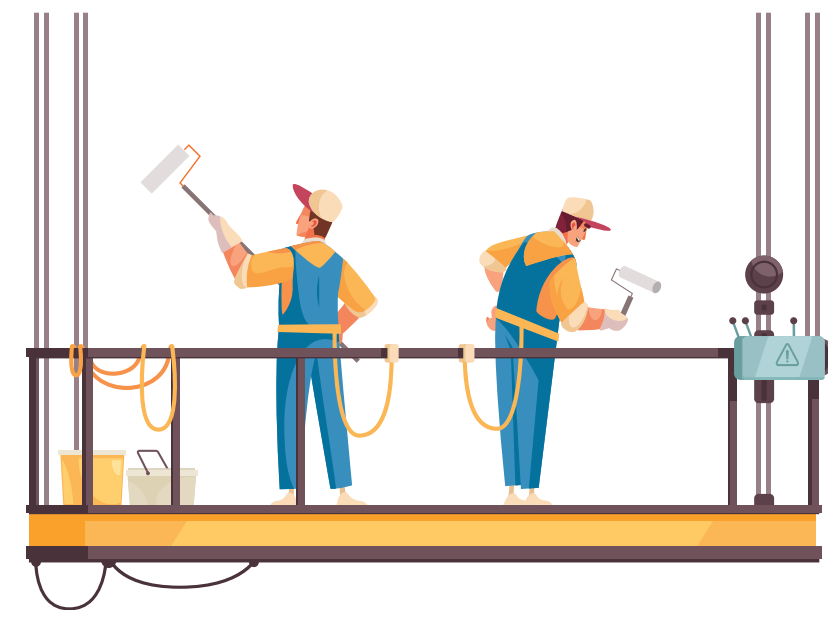


FOR SENIORS

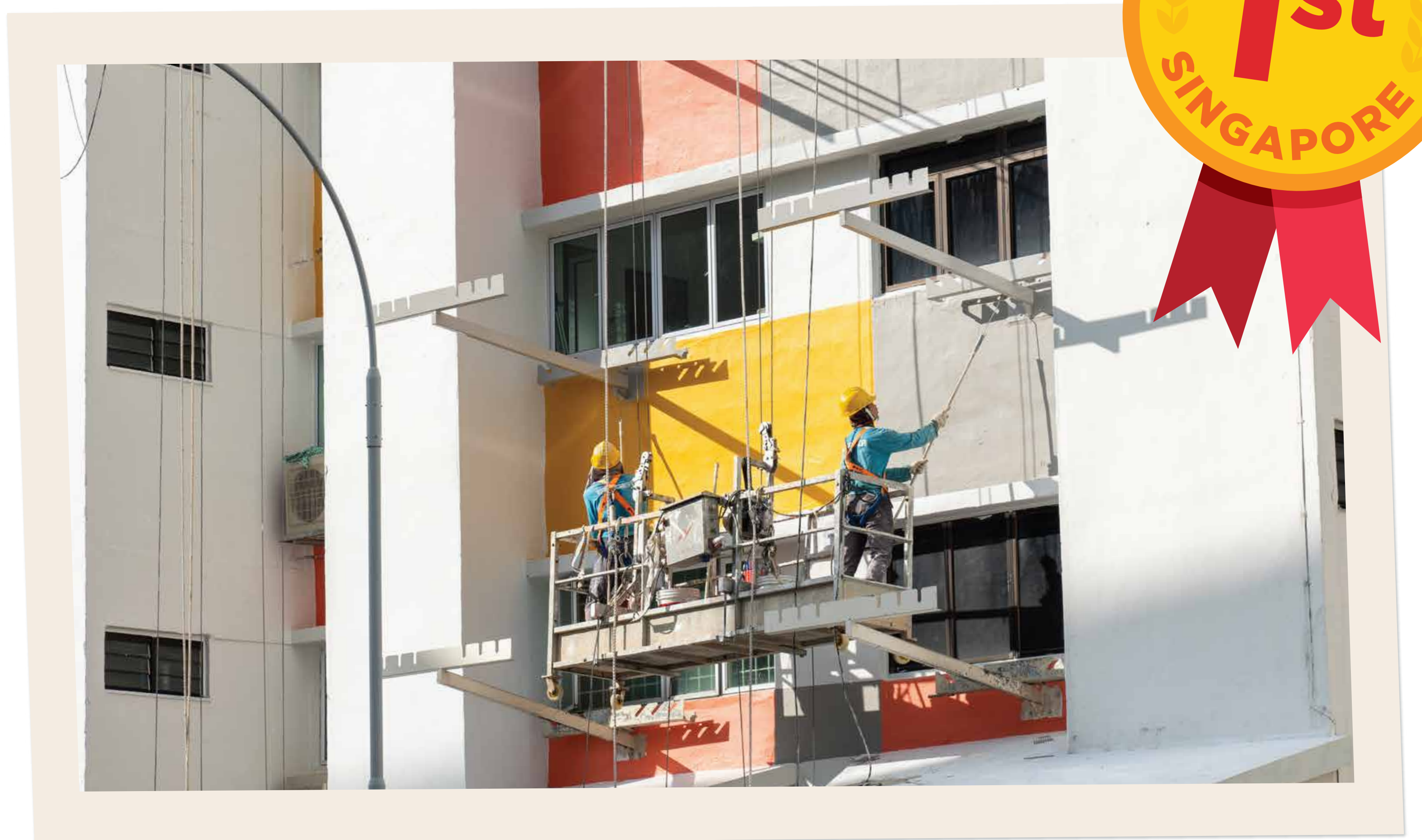

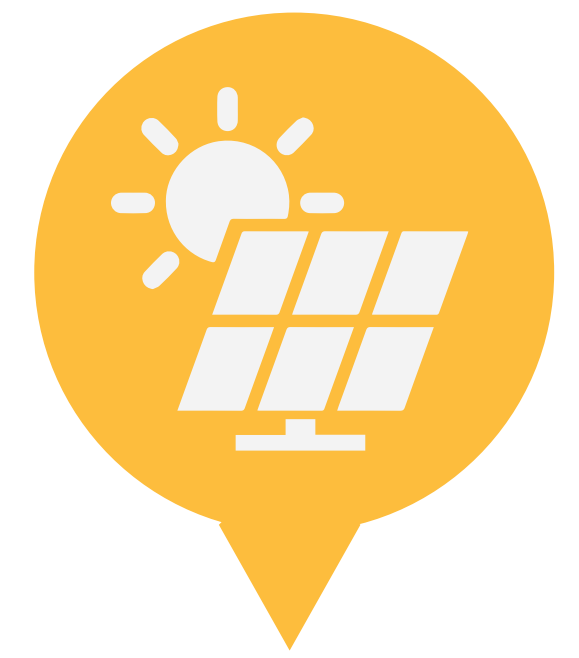
Heat-reflective paint reduces ambient temperature by up to **2 Degrees Celsius**, therefore improving comfort for residents while reducing energy consumption.

Solarnova Programme



Solar energy is harnessed to power common services (e.g. lifts, lights and water pumps) of HDB blocks in the day. By 2025, Tampines will generate enough solar energy to power the equivalent of **7000** four-room HDB flats.

Smart Light System



The lamps detect movement and will automatically adjust the brightness of LED lights in common areas. This **saves up to 60% energy** on top of savings from using LED. Blocks in Tampines GreenVines are installed with the latest Smart Lighting technology. More blocks will install the same system progressively.



Project Wolbachia

Our Defence Against Dengue

Tampines is one of the first towns to pilot Project Wolbachia. Covering the entire Tampines, Project Wolbachia has been effective in reducing the *Aedes Aegypti* mosquito population.

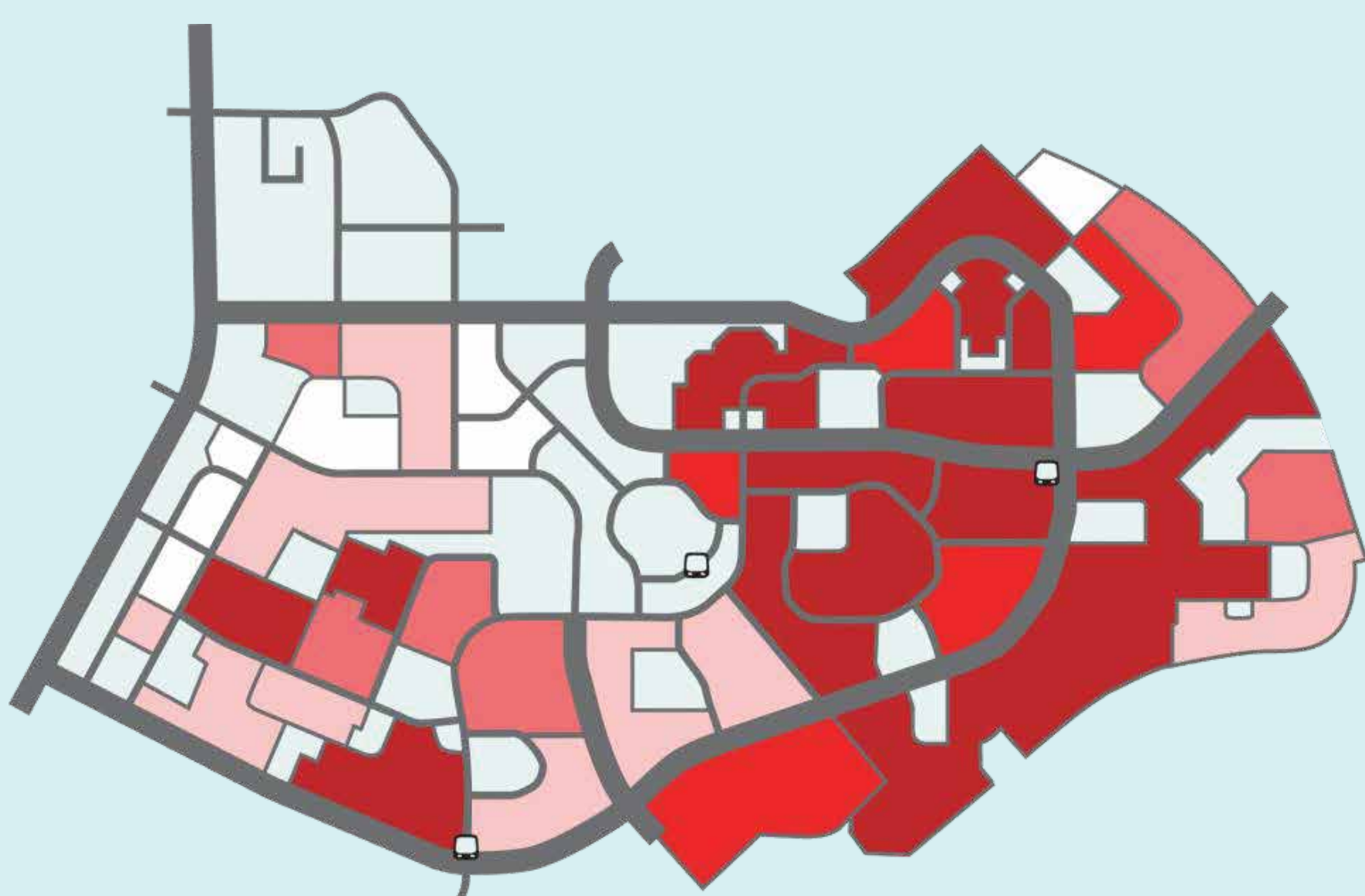

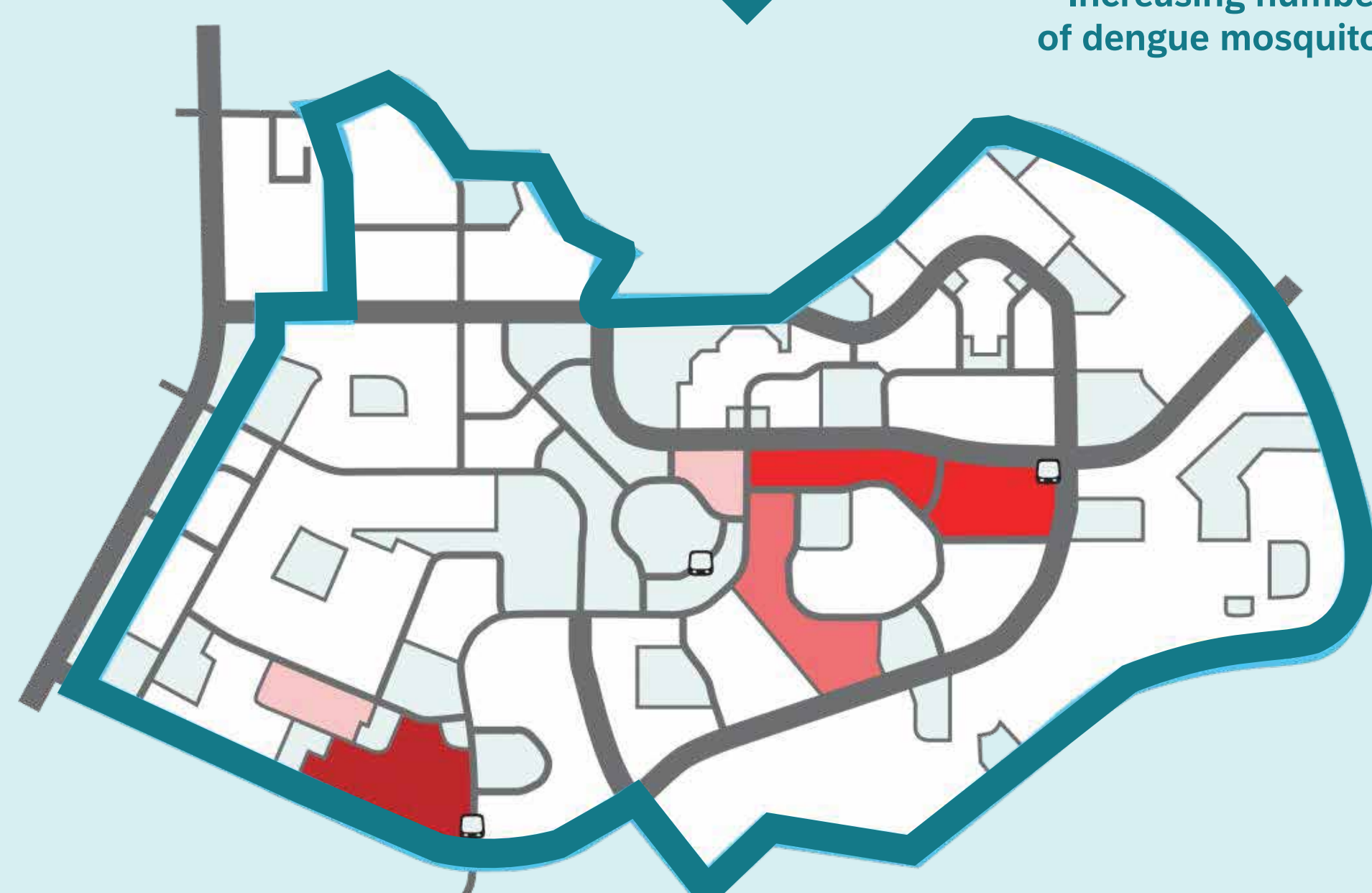

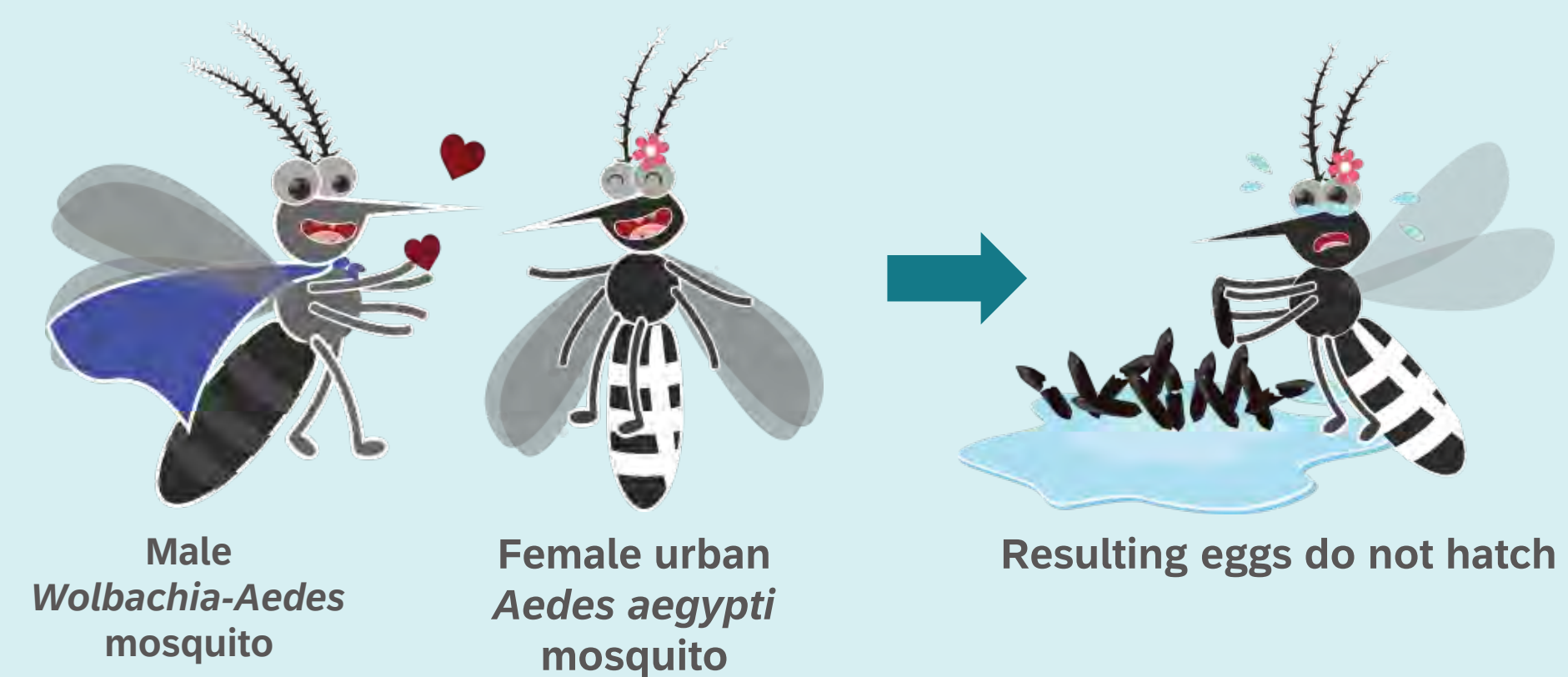

Enabling All To Take Climate Action

Tampines is an Eco-Town that offers all residents easy access to facilities that support a sustainable lifestyle, whether it is a community garden, an urban farm or a food waste recycling Black Soldier Fly (BSF) facility.

Sustainability @ Tampines Park

Singapore's First Community-Based Circular Ecosystem For Food Production



Residents play a part in community Eco-resilience

- 1 - Food waste from residents is collected and fed to BSF larvae, a type of decomposer.
- 2 - The nutrition-packed BSF larvae will be processed and fed to the fish, while the excreta (frass) is used to fertilise vegetables in a nearby community garden.
- 3 - The vegetables and tilapia will then be harvested, completing the cycle.



Black Soldier Fly Facility

Recycling Food Waste As A Community

Residents contribute food waste to the Black Soldier Fly facility to get green points for the redemption of free vegetables and tilapia fish from Tampines Park.

Aqualita Fish Farm

The container fish farm can produce up to **1200 kg** of jade perch annually. The fish is sold to the fishmongers in the Round Market. Tampines residents are the first in Singapore to buy fish farmed in their neighbourhood.

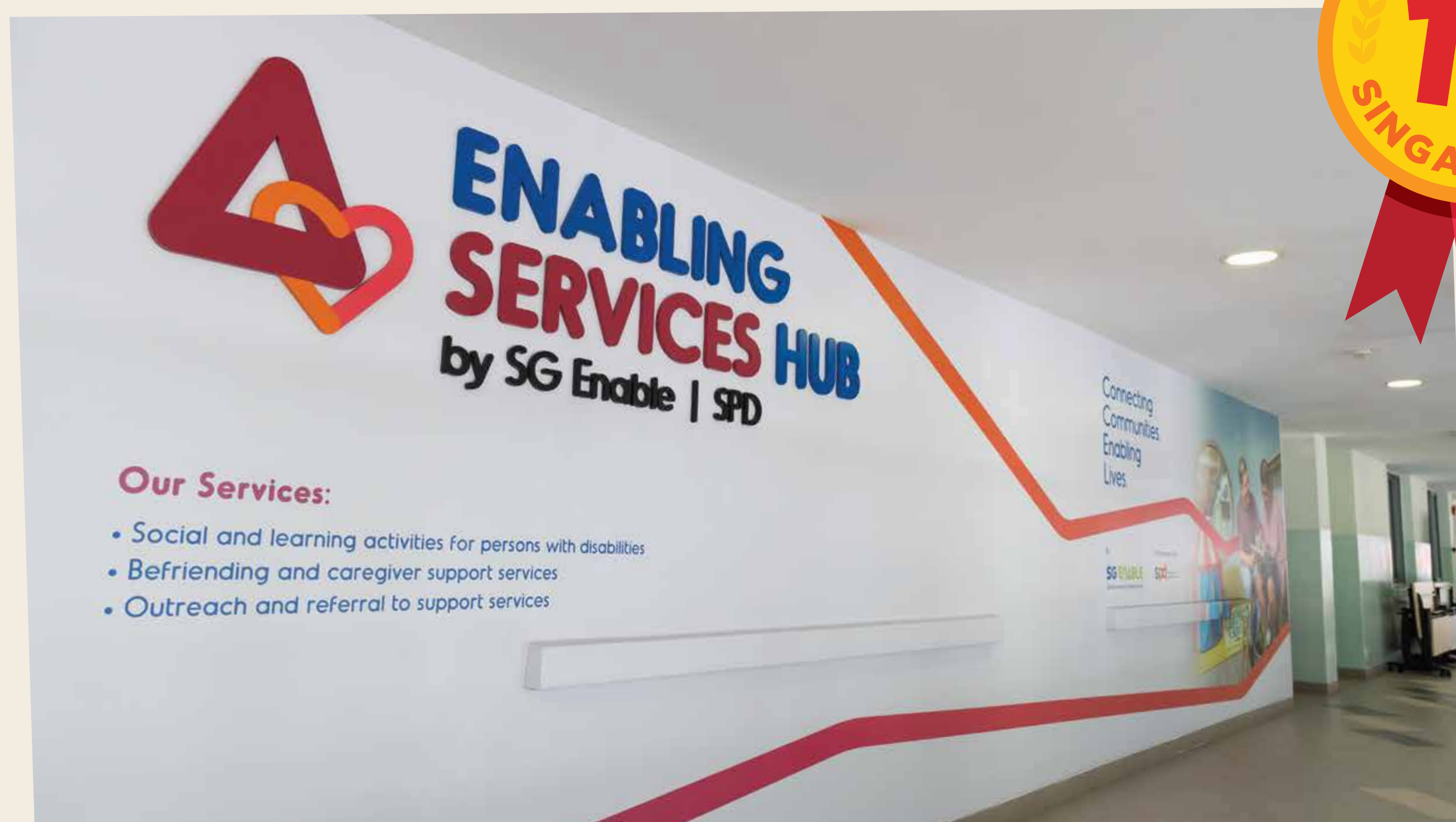
The first Enabling Services Hub (ESH) is set up in Tampines West CC. It offers closer-to-home community support for persons with disabilities and their caregivers.

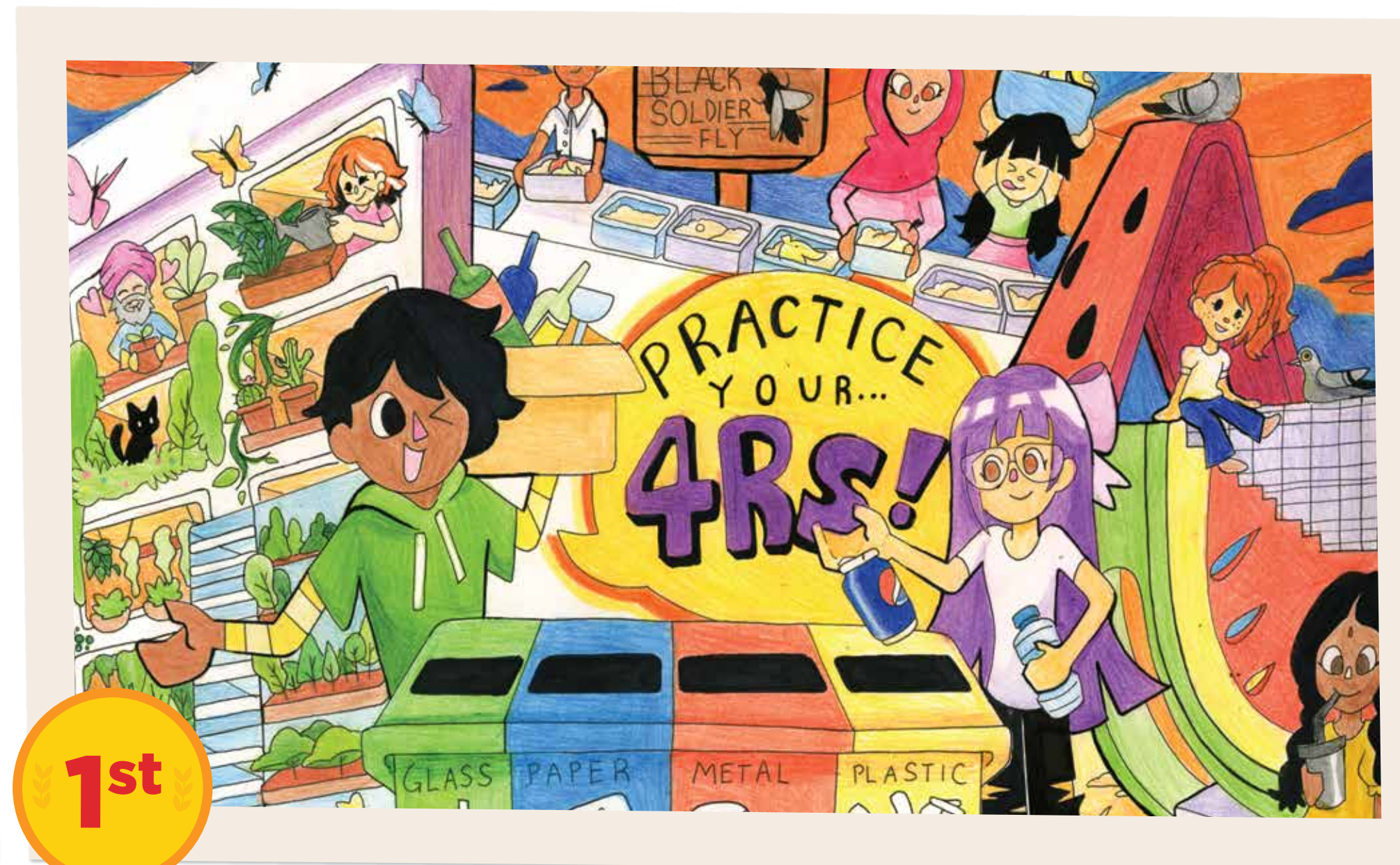

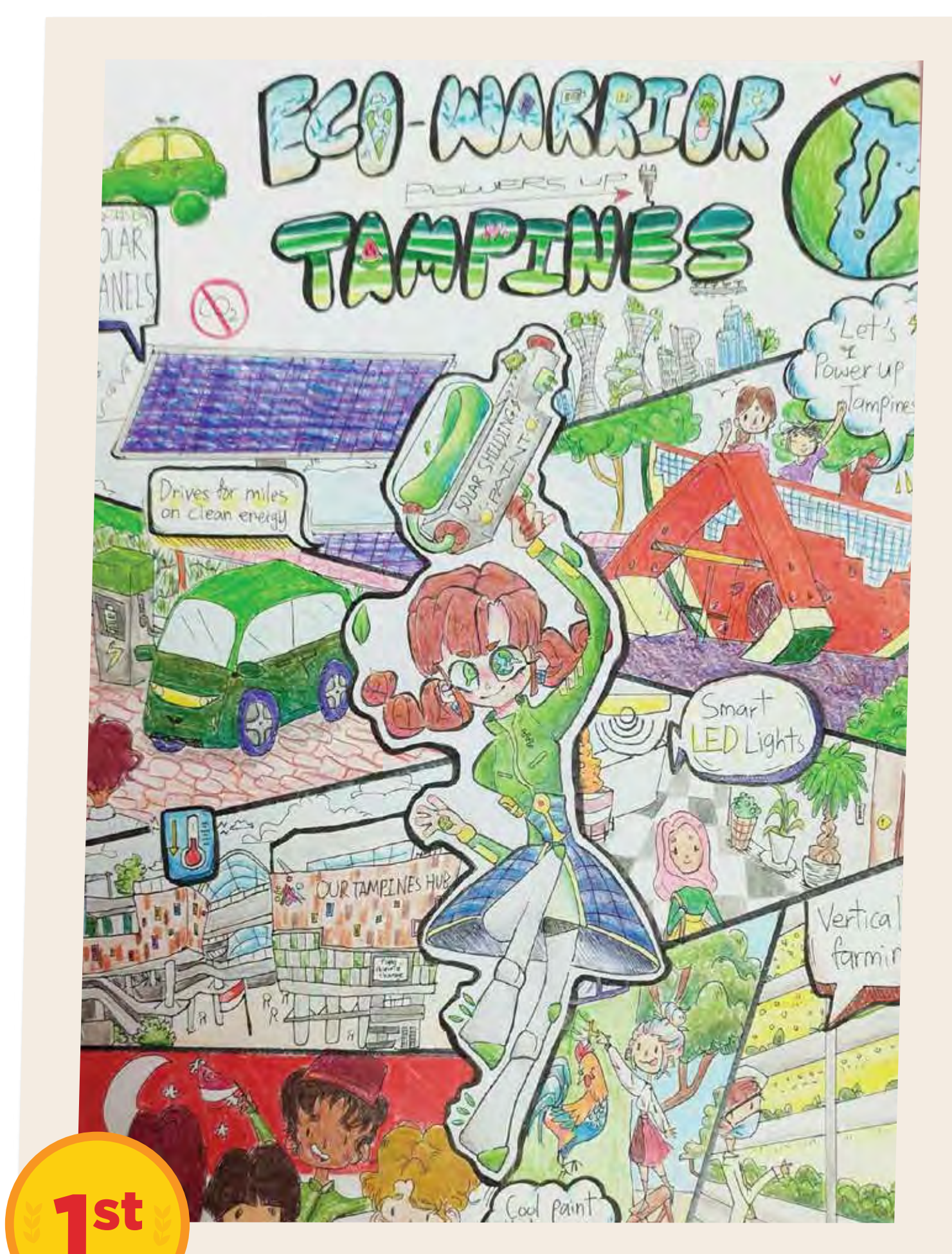
